

HENK POOT Leading a Spiritual Transformation

ome of the greatest leaders feel motivated to change the world at a very young age. Reverend Henk Poot stands out as someone whose commitment to the Bible from early childhood paved the path for him to assume a leadership role in revitalizing the Biblical Heartland.

Born in 1955 in Western Holland, Henk lived a God-centered life, attending church consistently and studying the Bible since childhood with a strong appreciation for its many inspirational stories. Understandably, Henk was able to perceive events of profound significance, and relating to Israel, through a Biblical lens.

Henk was just eleven years old when Israel miraculously liberated the Biblical Heartland in 1967 and felt as if the Bible's stories were playing out in real-time. "For me, it was an amazing re-enactment of all those stories in the Old Testament." Henk reflected. As the Bible was his central guide for life, Henk launched his adulthood with a six-year master's program in theology. Taking God's word seriously, Henk was determined to study

Hebrew, the Bible's original language, and with his understanding of Scriptures, Henk never separated Judea and Samaria from the Promised Land. On his very first visit to Israel in 1979, while still a master's student. Henk made certain to visit the ancient Biblical city of Shechem. "As a Christian coming for the first time, I felt that I came home," reminisced Henk.

Thereafter, Henk took his love of the Bible and the Land of Israel and shared it as a youth pastor with many others, moving from village to village. Eventually, Henk became a chaplain for the Dutch Navy where he organized tours to Israel for Navy personnel.

Henk seized the opportunity to make an impact in the Biblical Heartland when his friend Jeannet Van Duuren introduced him to CFOIC Heartland director, Sondra Oster Baras. The Second Intifada was brewing at the time, and with Sondra's help and guidance, Henk brought Christians on solidarity trips to

communities all over Judea and Samaria.

Henk remembers that he succeeded in forging a sense of trust from residents in the Biblical Heartland. Yet, Henk was also fully cognizant from the start that many in the region viewed Christian support for Israel with strong suspicion. Thus, during one of his visits to the community of Kochav Yaakov, Henk was emotionally moved when he saw a mother explain to her children, "these Christians do not hate us. They are our friends."

Seeking to further contribute to the Biblical Heartland, Henk became CFOIC's representative to Holland and a board member of Christians for Israel Holland (C4I Holland). Subsequently, Henk introduced C4I Holland to CFOIC Heartland. After becoming familiar with his independent initiative and authorship of a book delving into Jewish concepts, C4I Holland appointed Rev. Poot its head pastor. For many years now, C4I has worked in tandem with CFOIC Heartland.

"Working with Sondra and CFOIC Heartland has been an absolute blessing because it is so important to us that our donations to the communities in

the Biblical Heartland are always taken care of. Sondra and CFOIC Heartland could not be more reliable in making sure that happens," said Poot.

But Henk has a more global mission geared towards transforming the entire Christian world's perspective on the Biblical Heartland and People of Israel. "Christians have a duty to be good witnesses to others around them," explained Rev. Poot. "Our goal is to witness to the Church about the truth of the Land and People of Israel." Henk has done more than his share of witnessing by publishing a book that explains the Biblical and historic significance of countless Jewish communities in Judea and Samaria, an initiative supported by CFOIC Heartland. Henk also led other pastors to create strong bonds with CFOIC. Although Henk has retired, he devotes three days a week consulting to C4I Holland, which ensures that his mission will be carried on to the next generation.

Menachem Zur **Pioneering Through Perseverance**

modern-day pioneer, Menachem Zur grew up in Beit El, located right near the site where Jacob saw a ladder reaching the Heavens with angels ascending and descending its rungs. The vision was an apparent reminder for the Hebrew Patriarch that Divine Providence would help him persevere as he left the Promised Land. Menachem can relate as someone with a Divinely-inspired recipe for perseverance through any challenge.

A decade after Israel's miraculous victory in the Six Day War of 1967, Menachem's parents moved from Jerusalem to Beit El with a clear mission to spiritually strengthen the Biblical Heartland. Fully cognizant of the need to inculcate Biblical principles in the next generation, Menachem's father helped establish a yeshiva (Bible Academy) in Beit El and did the same in other small communities in the region. "I grew up in a reality in which our household was constantly involved in significant undertakings," reflected Menachem.

This reality prepared Menachem and his family to persevere through tragedy. On the seventh night of Hannukah in 1996. Menachem's parents and seven siblings were driving home to light Hanukah candles. As they neared Beit El, terrorists fired on their vehicle, sending shrapnel into their bodies.

Menachem, who was at his yeshiva in Shadmot Mechola, a small community located in the northern Jordan Valley, first heard cursory details of the attack from his teary-eyed cousin and the Rabbi of his yeshiva. "At the time, I thought it was just a routine incident in which nearby Arabs were throwing stones at my family's car," Menachem said. But Menachem soon found

out this was no routine stone-throwing attack. As he went back to the study hall to retrieve his phylacteries, he unexpectedly saw the entire

yeshiva reciting Psalms, a tradition of prayer in response to tragedy. Menachem's cousin and one of his rabbis accompanied him by taxi to his family who had been dispatched to Jerusalem's Hadassah Hospital, "It was the longest ride I ever had," Menachem related. And indeed, it was. On the way to the hospital, he learned of his mother's death, over the radio. Meanwhile, the rabbi was guiding him through the various rituals that would accompany him through the following days of mourning.

Menachem remembers, after reaching the hospital, his father's remarks, which still ring powerfully in his ears, as he sat at the bedside of Menachem's seriously wounded younger sister: "The terrorists may have killed a few of our bodies, but they will never kill our souls. We will continue living on, spreading as much happiness and blessing as possible." Menachem seized upon his father's advice

and lived life to the fullest. Menachem enlisted in the IDF and during his service, married his wife from Kiryat Arba, a community located near the ancient city of Hebron. Following his IDF career, Menachem joined Beit El's security team, eventually becoming the civilian security coordinator.

Menachem also became a pioneer in his own right. Like his father, Menachem strengthened Biblical education in Judea and Samaria by working for the Shadmot Mechola Hesder Yeshiva, where young men combine Bible study with IDF service. In September of 2019, he served as Shadmot Mechola's civilian security coordinator, and by December of 2022, he became its administrator. "A few decades ago, the last generation had their specific tasks to fulfill," Menachem added. "We now have ours."

Menachem could not feel more privileged to be living life surrounded by miracles. "We are living at a time when prophecy is being fulfilled in front of our eyes. Anyone who cannot see that is essentially denying the existence of Divine Providence." Menachem expresses enormous appreciation for Christian support of the communities in Judea and Samaria. "We cannot take for granted the fact that there are Christians around the world who see what is good about us, because unfortunately, most of the world simply does not understand us." And addressing himself directly to our Christian friends: "You will always be welcome in Shadmot Mechola!"
