KEEPING A WATCHFUL EYE

In 2002, the Hebron Hills community of Adora suffered a bloody terrorist attack that seared the hearts and lives of its residents forever. On a Shabbat morning, two Arab terrorists, disguised as Israeli soldiers, infiltrated the community and opened fire. Several were injured, and four residents were killed, including three adults and one five-year-old girl in her bed. Shaken and afraid for their lives, many families abandoned the community. Of the 80 families living in Adora at the time, only 23 remained. Life in the remote community of the Judean Hills was already hard and isolated before the tragedy. Those dedicated pioneers who stayed faced even greater isolation as they passed by so many empty houses, remembering friends and neighbors who had left. It was a difficult time indeed.

In the aftermath of the horrific bloodshed, Adora evaluated its security needs and took steps to fortify its defensive measures. They installed a security fence mounted with detection sensors around the community's perimeter and increased security patrols. Eventually, some of the original families returned to Adora, and later new building projects started going up. Today, 100 families live in Adora, an eclectic mix of secular and religious, older and young families. But even after all these years, that bloody Shabbat still casts its shadow upon the community. Adora's continued stability depends on absorbing additional families, but many still remember that terrorist attack, see the hostile Arab villages along the road to Adora, and are afraid to come.

With so many hostile Arab villages nearby, Adora lies in its enemies' crosshairs and continues to endure scores of hostile infiltration attempts. Their security team has managed to thwart numerous threats without significant injuries. But their security fence is outdated and has become a liability. Without a surveillance system that includes cameras and an advanced analytics system that runs even during power outages, Adora is severely disadvantaged. First responders desperately need early notification before an attack is underway. Otherwise, the probability of more bloodshed is high. A new sophisticated surveillance system is essential to keep families safe from harm.

Adora needs to purchase a comprehensive surveillance system to protect its families from constant terrorist threats. To survive in such a hostile environment, these resilient pioneers must have advance notice of a potential attack before lives are lost. Your help will ensure that the people of Adora have the equipment they desperately need to live safely while building and developing Biblical Israel.
