



# Revava

## A CLEAR VIEW TOWARD SAFETY

We know that God is good and kind. Tragedies, especially where innocent victims lose their lives, may cause a certain ambivalence, temporarily blurring our resolve. But ultimately, our belief in a merciful and gracious God (Exodus 34:6) helps us overcome the pain, waking us up from complacency, and often driving us to action.

In March 2011, Rabbi Moshe Talbi was traveling from Ariel to the community of Revava to visit his married daughter and granddaughter. But just before he arrived at his destination, he was attacked by Arab terrorists and shot to death at the side of the road leading to Revava. Security cameras in those days, located at the entrance to Revava, were older and less sophisticated. When security forces reviewed the footage, they discovered that a cloud had settled over the scene at the exact time of the attack, obscuring the view. In the aftermath of this devastating attack, the people of Revava understood that to keep their residents safe, they would have to install critical security equipment. Life was simply too precious.

The Religious Zionist people of Revava are dedicated to God and to settling their Biblical homeland. But their belligerent neighbors seem determined to thwart them at every turn. Situated between five hostile Arab villages, Revava has always faced the near-constant threat of infiltration and attack. But Rabbi Talbi's murder was the catalyst for change.

In the following years, the community created a comprehensive, multi-phase security plan, and in 2019, they completed the first phase of the program, thanks to the incredible generosity of CFOIC Heartland donors. Last year, Revava completed the second phase of the plan, with more daytime and thermal cameras as well as infrastructure installation. This year, their priority is to address vulnerability on the southeast perimeter of the community, the site of many homes and two schools. Only four hundred meters of wide-open field separates the Arab village of Haras from 700 Jewish children who study at the Revava school each day. On three prior occasions, Arabs traveling on foot from Haras attempted to infiltrate Revava from this very area. Without smart surveillance, alerting security forces of potential hostile threats, it is not a question of if, but when a terror attack will occur. The lives of many families and children are on the line. The community is desperate to install the surveillance cameras that will give Revava the edge it needs to guard itself against any threat.


