INVESTING IN THE NEXT GENERATION

The people of Neve Zuf have always been steadfast in their religious and ideological convictions. But on the night terrorists torched their community a few years ago, proud, trailblazing pioneers of the Biblical Heartland wept. They mourned, not only the homes they were forced to flee, but also the life they had built. Thank God no lives were lost, but the damage was extensive: 18 homes burned to the ground, 25 others sustained heavy damage, and a vast portion of the surrounding forest was completely destroyed.

Although the terrorists' fire ravaged their homes, no flames could ever burn down the ideology that inspired the creation of this inspiring community. The fierce dedication of its residents to the settlement movement, to inhabit and develop their Biblical Homeland, never wavered. After the fire, residents immediately returned to Neve Zuf, rebuilt their homes, developed new neighborhoods, and replanted trees while joyfully cultivating their rich communal bonds.

The teenagers of Neve Zuf, taking after their parents, are fiercely dedicated to their community, regularly extending a helping hand and participating in volunteer projects. Every year, they organize and host a Shabbat retreat for special-needs children, they build sukkahs (temporary huts for the Feast of Tabernacles) for elderly residents who are unable to do so on their own, and organize a special Shabbat celebration for the residents of a remotely located neighborhood. They also orchestrate an annual 5-K race, including logistics, fundraising, and advertising for the event, in memory of a resident murdered in a terrorist attack.

The people of Neve Zuf understand that teenagers have needs of their own. Following years of heavy use, the local youth center and much of its furnishings have fallen into disrepair. Initially, the teens attempted to renovate the structure themselves, but without financial resources, their efforts bore little fruit. The community would like to reward these selfless teens for their tireless commitment to the community by renovating the youth center and purchasing new games and equipment. But to make this blessing a reality, Neve Zuf needs your help.
