In Genesis 13:8-9, while journeying back from Egypt, Abraham and his nephew, Lot, travel through the Judean Desert. There, they quarrel and eventually decide to part ways. Lot chooses to go south, settling in Sodom and Gomorrah, near the Dead Sea, and Abraham goes north, settling in Bet El. Their point of departure is located near the modern-day community of Alon. But, unlike our Biblical figures, the people of Alon have chosen to resolve their differences by staying together. As a result, they have created a unique, tight-knit community rooted in tolerance, cooperation, and support.

While not all families in Alon have the same religious commitment, all are eager for their children to receive a firm grounding in Jewish education and the Bible. The local schools, catering to both religiously observant and non-observant families, take pride in their mixed classes, where students learn early on to respect the beliefs of others. The schools offer a Biblical Culture Program, which provides extra-curricular resources and programming to add a spiritual dimension to the student's curriculum. In addition to the unique educational system in Alon, the community's vibrant community life continuously draws many new families. The library serves as the community's epicenter, offering a wide variety of cultural, spiritual, educational, and social enrichment programs for all ages and interests.
