## **Bekaot** A PLACE TO GROW

Family conflict is natural. Some family members may not see eye to eye, giving rise to fighting, hurt feelings, and distance. But family bonds are precious and not easily broken. With the proper perspective, conflict provides an opportunity to repair the damage and heal.

Bekaot, an isolated agricultural community in the Jordan valley, was a thriving community for decades. But seven years ago, they experienced a community rift that impacted community cohesiveness and wrecked every aspect of community life, including their agricultural enterprises. Bekaot was crumbling. Today the people of Bekaot are united in their desire to save their beloved community. They are working hard to mend social bonds and encourage volunteerism, both among the adults and the youth.

Isolation poses a major challenge for anyone, but especially for energetic teenagers. Without a youth center, teens began choosing to leave Bekaot to attend boarding schools, and parents were fearful their children would turn to harmful behaviors. A youth center was needed to provide a safe and inviting place for all teenagers, grades 7 through 12, to engage in enriching programs, social gatherings, and volunteer initiatives.

The community took the first steps to create a youth program. A resident, who volunteered to act as a youth coordinator, has been leading programs rooted in the Biblical values of love of the Land of Israel, kindness, and volunteer initiatives. One of the program's first initiatives involved local teens helping the community's remaining founding pioneers who are in their golden years and need additional help to continue living independently. Bekaot teenagers regularly visit local seniors, mow lawns, and do light house maintenance at their homes. But these budding youth initiatives needed a center.

Last year, the community designated an existing building as a youth center. Eager to participate in the efforts, the youth worked to clean and paint the building. But the building was in need of serious renovation. Thanks to generous CFOIC Heartland donors, Bekaot recently renovated the kitchenette and bathroom and installed new flooring. However, Bekaot needs your continued help to purchase furniture and equipment to create a truly comfortable and inviting space.

Bekaot, a small, isolated community in the Jordan Valley, needs your help to furnish a youth center and create a safe space for their local teens.
