HELP PREVENT THE NEXT TERROR ATTACK

While parents have plenty to worry about when it comes to their children's safety, ideally the home is a secure sanctuary where kids are safe from harm. But in Roi, locking the doors is no longer enough to protect families from imminent danger.

Forty-eight families live in Roi today, including the original pioneers and the second generation who returned to raise their families in the community. Due to their extreme isolation and vulnerability to ongoing threats of terrorism, the people of Roi are now in need of an upgraded security system that will protect the town's residents.

There is probably no better testament to this need than what transpired on April 7th. On their way to a Passover family vacation, as they drove through the Jordan Valley, Lucy Dee along with her daughters Maia, 20, and Rina, 15 were gunned down in a brutal terror attack that shook the nation. At the funeral of his daughters, through desperate tears of mourning, Rabbi Leo Dee, in an inspirational, positive message, expressed gratitude to God for his three children who remained alive. All of the attackers are still at large. Residents of Jordan Valley towns, including Roi, are on high alert knowing that their small oasis of a community is now a target in the crosshairs of cruel jihadists.

The community of Roi is located just a few kilometers away from the site of the shooting, prompting local residents to take action to ensure that the same local terrorists don't infiltrate their village. Like most communities in Judea, Roi has its share of security concerns. Molotov cocktails and other arson-related attacks, stone-throwing, and frequent infiltration attempts are common. However, after the vicious murder of the Dee family, the people of Roi understood they needed an advanced surveillance system to defend their community. That's why they are now requesting surveillance cameras to better protect the weak points on their perimeter fence. These security needs include not only surveillance cameras, but also the computer equipment needed to operate them as well as concrete reinforcement for the perimeter gate.

Roi urgently needs your help to purchase security equipment to protect and defend their families from hostile attacks, including threats of arson and roadside shootings. Security is not a luxury; it is a necessity. Your support will give the pioneers of Roi the vital equipment they need to prevent future attacks while safely continuing to settle Biblical Israel.
