PROTECTING JEWISH LIVES

Judea and Samaria have had spiritual and national significance for the Jewish people for millennia. God promised Abraham and his descendants the Land in an eternal covenant (Genesis 13:15). Hence it was forever dubbed “The Promised Land.” With the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948, Jews from all over the world began moving back to Israel, but only after 1967, following the Six-Day War, were Jews able to return to the Heartland of the Promised Land—Judea and Samaria.

Today, Samaria is home to over 120,000 Jews, living in more than 30 small communities and several larger towns spread across a large area in the heart of Israel. Despite ongoing security and safety concerns, the people of Samaria are unwavering in their commitment to fulfilling Biblical prophecy. But since early 2022, the number of terror attacks throughout Israel has surged by over 300%, with Samaria at the center of the escalation. From terrorists throwing stones and fire-bombs on the roads to shootings, explosive devices, stabbings, and car rammings, innocent families face peril and injury every day with no end in sight.

The Samaria Regional Municipality oversees and supports security activities for the small communities in the region. The increase in terror attacks, combined with the recent increase in earthquakes, highlights the urgent need for a regional crisis management center to help effectively monitor, coordinate, and manage significant security events. To make this vision a reality, the Samaria Regional Municipality has already begun building the center, but they still need help with the cost of purchasing communications equipment and furniture.

Surveillance cameras in busy regional intersections and digital antennas are critical to ensure quick response times and improved emergency management in the region. While the Samaria Regional Municipality has already equipped key intersections with surveillance cameras and communication-enhancing digital antennas, they desperately need help outfitting additional junctions with this essential security equipment. Additionally, small communities with limited budgets struggle to provide their first response team volunteers with necessary gear, such as protective helmets and rugged tablets. Such equipment is critical to ensure their safety while enabling them to protect the families in their communities.

The Samaria Regional Council desperately needs vital surveillance and security equipment to protect and defend Jewish communities from the constant threat of terrorism. The dedicated pioneers of Samaria have returned to resettle in their ancestral homeland. Your help today will equip them with the tools they need to prevent and manage emergency events.
